SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Warwick Academy was founded in 1662 and is commonly said to be the oldest private school in continuous operation in the Western Hemisphere. The school caters to students 5 – 18 years of age and has an enrollment of 780 with a teaching staff of 70. Warwick Academy is an academically selective, co-educational school, essentially organised along British lines, which seeks a diverse college bound student body.

Since 1996 the school has adopted the United Kingdom National Curriculum and students write the IGCSE and GCSE examinations at the end of Year 11 (Grade 10). Students generally pursue 7 – 10 subjects to IGCSE/GCSE examination level. All take English Language and Mathematics, a science (Chemistry, Physics or Biology), a foreign language (French, Spanish or a dual option) and a humanity (Geography, History, Business Studies or Information Technology). Additional subjects are chosen from the above list and from English Literature, Art and Design, Food Technology, Design and Technology, Physical Education and Music.

ENROLLMENT IN THE IB PROGRAMME

In the Sixth Form, Year 12 and Year 13, (Grade 11 and 12) students are enrolled in either the IB Diploma Programme or the IB Certificates Programme. Students graduate from Warwick Academy at the completion of Year 13 (Grade 12).
